Our Campuses

We have four campuses across central locations in Merseyside. All are easy to get to by bus, train or car.

1. Balliol Road Campus

How we can help support your finances

We understand that coming to college can be a big financial commitment, but worries over money and finance shouldn't stop students from studying at college. We want to give them the support they need to achieve their goals and we have a number of packages to help:

- 16-18 Bursary term-time bus pass* and subsidised / free meals.
- Vulnerable Bursary worth up to £1,200, this is for 16-18 year olds claiming Income Support or Disability Living Allowance and Employment Support Allowance or if they are in care.
- FREE bus service from south Liverpool to Hugh Baird College.
- FREE healthy breakfast (available to all students).
- 19+ LSF Package: travel support and childcare.
- Care to Learn: for students aged between 16 and 20 with young children, to help with childcare and travel expenses.
- Advanced Learner Loan: for students aged 19+ who are planning to study a Level 3 qualification.**

How we can help support your studies

Hugh Baird College is an inclusive learning environment with a supportive culture. Our mission is "to inspire, challenge and transform lives" and we promote equality in everything we do. We aim to provide the same opportunities to every individual regardless of their background or their disability.

We welcome learners with a wide range of special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) and tailor the support offered to meet your individual needs, therefore, no support package looks the same.

Support packages are agreed between the student, the support staff and Tutors and remain flexible during their studies. To give you an idea of the types of support available, this could include:

- Additional study skills tuition
- Assistive technology and assistive technology training
- Care support
- Exam access arrangements
- In-class support with an Academic Support Worker
- Specialist dyslexia tuition.

Undergraduates are increasingly recognising the benefits of staying closer to home and continuing their education locally, making the best progression into their working lives without running up debts through accommodation and living costs.

In this session, we will cover the benefits of moving away to study vs the advantages of staying local and accessing some of the best degree qualifications in an affordable way, around existing family and work commitments.

Personal statement and university application workshop



GATSBY BENCHMARK 1, 3, 4, 7 & 8

Session length: 30 mins

Can be delivered virtually: Yes

Suitable for groups of 10-50 Y13 students

This interactive workshop explains the process of UCAS and University applications alongside advice on writing a personal statement.

Workshop content includes:

- The importance of personal statements.
- Examples of what makes a good/bad personal statement.
- Participants will be given a framework for writing their own statement.
- Students will be able to understand the process of applying through UCAS, identify key strengths, skills and experiences to include in a personal statement and produce a suitable personal statement to support course) choices and enable them to gain the place they want.

Subject Specific Tours



GATSBY BENCHMARK 3, 4 & 7

Some pupils know exactly what they want to do; the subject specific tours are designed to support them as they move towards progressing to College. The chance to visit the course areas and meet the tutors they will work with can offer pupils a great boost, showing them a glimpse of their future and motivating them to achieve their goals in school.
