# PART-TIME MATHS AND ENGLISH FOR ELECTIVELY HOME EDUCATED STUDENTS

This part-time route is specifically designed for students who are currently Electively Home Educated. It is open to students who will be 14 on the 31st August of the year they commence and is a two-year programme.

Students must be registered with their local authority as Home Educated in order to be accepted onto the programme. Students will study in discrete classes, with four hours of face to face delivery per subject, plus an hour of 'blended learning', where they will interact with a lecturer through our online platform (Microsoft Teams).

## 2018/2019 STATS

- 100% of all Hugh Baird 14-16 College students went on to either Further Education, employment or training/apprenticeships.
- 93% pass rate in all core subjects (GCSE English, Maths and Science).
- 80% of students went on to study Further Education, 52% of those continued to study at Hugh Baird College.

## HOW TO APPLY FOR THE HUGH BAIRD 14-16 COLLEGE

### STEP 1:

Express your interest in the 14-16 College by visiting [www.hughbaird.ac.uk/14-16-college-registration](http://www.hughbaird.ac.uk/14-16-college-registration)

### STEP 2:

You will be contacted by a staff member of the 14-16 College who will arrange a time for you to come to College for an interview. Once this is agreed, you will receive confirmation of the interview in writing from the 14-16 College team. You will also be sent an application pack for you to complete prior to you attending your interview.

### STEP 3:

Your interview will take place with one of our experienced 14-16 College team. No decision will be given immediately. Instead, we will ask you for a named contact at your current/previous school in order for us discuss your application further.

### STEP 4:

The 14-16 College team will contact your current/previous school to request certain documentation. Once this has been received, the 14-16 College team will meet to decide on whether to offer you a place at the College. You will then be invited to attend a Transition Day.

### STEP 5:

Once all the previous steps have been completed, a decision letter will be sent out to you.
